LEARNING

- L1 UQ <u>ranks</u> in the top 50 in the world in 22 subjects, with the QS World University Rankings by Subject 2018 placing UQ first in Australia for Chemical Engineering and Environmental Sciences.
- **L2** Ethics in leadership is the <u>focus</u> of a new million-dollar partnership between UQ and global business leader Mark Hutchinson.
- ARC Centre of Excellence for Environment Decisions Director Professor Kerrie Wilson has been appointed to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Committee.
- L4 Professor Karen Hussey has been invited to serve on the scientific advisory board for the new Helmholtz-Institute for Functional Marine Biodiversity at the University of Oldenburg.
- Professor Flavio Menezes has been <u>appointed</u> as a chairperson to the Australian Research Council Research Evaluation Committee and will play a key role in the 2018 Excellence in Research for Australia assessment.
- LG UQ has appointed a Chief Student Entrepreneur to inspire and mentor young innovators.
- Four researchers are preparing to travel to the United States to advance their work after being awarded Fulbright Scholarships.
- L8 An aspiring neuroscientist awarded a Westpac Future Leaders Scholarship will <u>undertake</u> her PhD at QBI.
- **L9** UQ PhD student Dr Van-Hau Trieu <u>won</u> the ICIS Dissertation Award for her thesis on business information systems.
- L10 Professor Nicholas Aroney was <u>appointed</u> by the Prime Minister to an expert panel to examine whether Australian law adequately protects the human right to freedom of religion.
- **L11** Five UQ students and five graduates will be <u>vying</u> for glory at the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games.
- L12 Australian Commonwealth Games athletes are among a group of 58 students <u>awarded</u> UQ 2018 Sporting Scholarships.
- **L13** A detailed and complex investigation process <u>ceased</u> in March when a senior staff member resigned with immediate effect during an investigation into an allegation of sexual misconduct.
- Under the leadership of the DVC (Academic) and Provost, implementation of the <u>UQ Student</u> Strategy will be ramped up in 2018, backed by \$13 million in funding.

DISCOVERY

- **D1** A \$96 million Australian Government fund designed to assist vulnerable young people is to be evaluated in a research project led by UQ.
- **D2** Leopards may reduce bites and subsequent rabies risk for people by <u>consuming</u> feral dogs in Mumbai, India.
- D3 There may be more benefits to <u>deleting</u> your Facebook account than just protecting your private data it could also reduce your stress levels.
- Work designed to improve diagnosis of sepsis one of the leading causes of death in children
 is <u>underway</u> in Brisbane, led by a UQ researcher.
- A massive global study involving 58,000 cattle has <u>pinpointed</u> the genes that influence the complex genetic trait of height in cattle.
- **D6** If you want to be told a secret you're better off being assertive and compassionate rather than enthusiastic and polite.
- **D7** Australians are among the most <u>mobile</u> people in the world, with four in 10 changing address every five years, and nearly 15 per cent moving every year.
- **D8** Scientists have found that <u>targeting</u> micro-organisms in the gut, known as microbiota, could have the potential to help prevent type 1 diabetes.
- **D9** Setting reminders and visual cues for forgetful children could be a <u>solution</u> for parents frustrated over missed chores and homework.
- **D10** More targeted and effective treatments for some of the world's most complex diseases in humans may be a step closer, <u>thanks</u> to research that better maps disease susceptibility to genes and DNA.
- **D11** Therapeutics inspired by venoms could provide the key to treatment for a common gastrointestinal disease if a collaboration between researchers from UQ and Danish biotech company Zealand Pharma A/S is successful.
- **D12** UQ venom researchers have <u>uncovered</u> a unique and complex venom system within the tiny assassin bug.
- **D13** Dogs stressed by animal shelter life may <u>benefit</u> from soothing classical music and whiffs of lavender.
- **D14** Coral reef fish <u>learn less</u> when they have a parasite infection and can't access 'cleaning' fish such as wrasse.
- **D15** Being underweight or overweight could <u>affect</u> the age at which women experience menopause.
- **D16** Researchers have <u>shown</u> why a fragment of a protein from the venom gland of rattlesnakes could be the basis for an alternative to conventional antibiotics.
- **D17** The death of coral reefs is a more significant factor in the erosion of tropical coastlines than rising sea levels, an international study has revealed.

- **D18** UQ scientists have <u>completed</u> a forensic-style investigation into fossils of the *Isisfordia duncani*, and found the diminutive crocodilians lived and died in brackish-water deltas.
- **D19** Herbicide-resistant weeds are <u>threatening</u> food security, but UQ researchers are one step closer to a solution after a new discovery.
- **D20** Scientists have <u>discovered</u> a new type of stem cell which has the potential to perform two functions at the same time, meaning better treatment or even cures for many diseases.
- **D21** Researchers comparing the use of two drugs for pregnant women who do not go into labour shortly after their waters break have found both are reasonable options.
- **D22** Sea level variations on the Great Barrier Reef linked to global temperature changes thousands of years ago may help <u>predict</u> future changes.
- **D23** South-East Queensland is in <u>danger</u> of losing one of the last remaining populations of one of Australia's most melodic songbirds, the Eastern bristlebird.
- **D24** Australians who commit white-collar crimes such as fraud should face stronger penalties.
- **D25** A family of potent protein neurotoxins has been <u>discovered</u> in bootlace worms.
- **D26** UQ and La Trobe University scientists have <u>produced</u> proteins suitable for developing drugs in plants, on a large scale.
- **D27** A new therapy to help infants with acute respiratory infection will <u>prevent</u> thousands of infants with bronchiolitis from requiring escalation of care when admitted to hospital and save more than \$200 million in hospital costs.
