LEARNING

- L1 UQ's reputation for global student exchange has helped <u>attract</u> 62 <u>Australia Awards Endeavour Scholarships and Fellowships</u> for 2018, the most of any university in Australia.
- L2 Executive education and postgraduate study opportunities will be more accessible following the launch of UQ's new city site at 293 Queen Street, Brisbane.
- UQ graduates have <u>garnered</u> some of the highest levels of employer satisfaction in Australia in the <u>Employer Satisfaction Survey</u>.
- **L4** High profile foreign correspondent Peter Greste has <u>joined</u> the UQ School of Communication and Arts as the UNESCO Chair of Journalism and Communication.
- **L5** The UQx Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) program has <u>reached</u> two million enrolments, and is set to continue growing as it expands its MicroMasters offerings.
- UQ is one of nine high-ranking universities to <u>launch</u> a "virtual exchange" that will allow students to gain program credits through select online courses.
- L7 After more than a century of graduations, UQ <u>celebrated</u> a major milestone in December: 250,000 graduates.
- **L8** UQ is <u>offering</u> a range of new undergraduate and postgraduate study options in response to international and local demand.
- L9 Dr Vincent Wheatley, Carl Sherwood and UQ's First Year Chemistry Program were <u>recognised</u> at the Australian Awards for University Teaching Excellence.
- L10 Professor Michael Haugh and Associate Professor Greg Hainge, from UQ's School of Languages and Cultures, have been elected to the Australian Academy of the Humanities.
- A powder extracted from the Kakadu plum has <u>earned</u> Associate Professor Yasmina Sultanbawa and her team a national award for community engagement.
- L12 The Australian Government has <u>awarded</u> scholarships to three UQ students as part of its New Colombo Plan 2018 round.
- L13 A passion for bringing English literature to the public has <u>led</u> to a Rhodes Scholarship for UQ student Damian Maher.
- L14 Three UQ graduates will further their studies at the distinguished Cambridge and Oxford universities after winning postgraduate scholarships.
- L15 Student entrepreneurs from UQ's Idea Hub took on Tel Aviv's world-leading startup scene in the exclusive UQ Startup Adventures.
- UQ and <u>DXC Technology</u> have <u>partnered</u> to form the Queensland Neurodiversity Hub, which will provide students with autism greater access to employment opportunities.

- The UQx MOOC program <u>Crime101x: The Psychology of Criminal Justice</u> collected a bronze award at the 2018 <u>Wharton-QS Stars Reimagine Education Awards</u>.
- L18 UQ student Emma Sievwright is <u>rising</u> to the heat as a contestant in The Great Australian Bake Off.
- **L19** The UQ Business School has had its Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business accreditation <u>renewed</u> for the fourth time.
- Long-serving UQ Senate member Philip Hennessey and Professor Laurence Walsh have each received an Order of Australia in the Australia Day 2018 Honours List.
- **L21** UQ has <u>appointed</u> a Chief Student Entrepreneur Ben Coughlin to inspire and mentor young innovators.

DISCOVERY

- **D1** UQ research into dementia, superbugs, painkillers, and children's health will <u>benefit</u> from \$42.9m in National Health and Medical Research Council 2018 Project Grant funding.
- An antibiotic overlooked since its discovery 40 years ago could help develop new drugs against some of the world's most dangerous superbugs, UQ research <u>suggests</u>.
- **D3** UQ researchers have <u>found</u> that freckles and moles appearing on the iris indicate a high risk of melanoma, particularly in people under 40 years of age.
- **D4** Wild rice growing in northern Australia's crocodile-infested waters could help boost global food security, <u>say</u> UQ researchers.
- **PS** Research to develop non-addictive analgesics that could potentially be used as alternatives to addictive opioid drugs such as codeine will be <u>undertaken</u> by UQ.
- NASA experiments to grow wheat in space were the inspiration for UQ scientists to <u>develop</u> the world's first 'speed breeding' procedures here on planet Earth.
- **D7** Gossiping helps a person develop a better understanding of their society's expected behaviours, researchers from UQ have <u>found</u>.
- **D8** Forty two babies are stillborn in Australia every week, and 60 per cent of them are recorded as "unexplained", UQ researchers have <u>revealed</u>.
- **D9** Adding aspirin to some existing cancer drugs could increase their effectiveness against a group of tumours resistant to treatment, new UQ research has <u>shown</u>.
- **D10** New dipstick technology that enables pathogen detection and the rapid diagnosis of human, animal and plant disease has been <u>developed</u> by UQ scientists.
- **D11** New UQ research <u>shows</u> that chronic stress suppresses the immune system's response to cancer, reducing the effectiveness of immunotherapy treatments.
- **D12** UQ researchers have new <u>insights</u> into how protective antibodies attack dengue viruses, which could lead to more effective dengue fever vaccines and drug therapies.

- **D13** UQ researchers have <u>provided</u> fresh insight into the diversity of dinosaurs that inhibited the Australian-Arctic rift valley, having identified a dinosaur species discovered a decade ago.
- **D14** UQ researchers <u>say</u> almost half of Australian families tracked in a 30-year study have experienced poverty as least once.
- **D15** Inadequate oxygen levels during sleep can damage the brain and increase the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease, UQ researchers have <u>found</u>.
- **D16** Listening to white noise can increase your ability to learn news words, a study by UQ has revealed.
- **D17** The rollout of low aromatic fuel has contributed to significant and sustained reduction in petrol sniffing and associated health problems in Indigenous communities, UQ studies have found.
- **D18** Rising temperatures will put almost one quarter of trees in Australian cities at risk by 2070, according to a study involving a UQ researcher.
- **D19** Exercise is an important part of recovery for people with brain injury, UQ researchers have found.
- **D20** Just three per cent of the Great Barrier Reef's coral may hold the key to regenerating reefs damaged after major disturbances, UQ research has <u>revealed</u>.
- **D21** Researchers from UQ have <u>discovered</u> that a key gene which controls flowering time in wheat and barley crops also directs the plant's root growth.
- **D22** The female central bearded dragons are <u>hiding</u> a secret their embryos temporarily grow the lizard equivalent of a penis during development.
- **D23** A new and improved version of the 'love hormone' oxytocin has been <u>developed</u> by UQ researchers.
- **D24** Neck pain is a common condition among office workers, but regular workplace exercise can prevent and reduce it, a UQ study has <u>found</u>.
- **D25** New UQ research <u>shows</u> that gay and lesbian couples tend to have higher-quality relationships than their heterosexual counterparts.
- **D26** The degradation of coral reefs might have short-term benefits for some fish groups, but would be bad for fisheries long term, <u>according</u> to a UQ-led study.
- **D27** Mimicking sleep processes in the awake brain of elderly people could prevent age-related decline in brain function, UQ research has <u>revealed</u>.
- **D28** Fleas from domestic pets are infesting native wildlife and feral animals in all continents except Antarctica, a new UQ study <u>reveals</u>.
- **D29** A new understanding of the complex ways in which general anaesthetics act on the brain could eventually lead to improved drugs for surgery, UQ researchers have <u>found</u>.
- **D30** Tiger sharks appear to be genetically monogamous and it could be putting the species at risk, UQ research has <u>revealed</u>.
- **D31** An international review led by UQ researchers has <u>revealed</u> that predators and scavengers ranging from bats to leopards and vultures are valuable to human health and well-being.

- **D32** A UQ discovery <u>has</u> deepened our understanding of the genetic mutations that arise in different tissues, and how these are inherited.
- **D33** Tiny crystals that form deep in volcanoes may be the key for advance warnings before volcanic eruptions, UQ research has <u>revealed</u>.
- **D34** UQ experts are helping thoroughbred horse breeders combat a hairy caterpillar threat that causes abortion in mares and costs the Australian racing industry millions of dollars every year.

- E7 Senior academics from China Nine and Australia's Group of Eight universities gathered at UQ for the China-Australia University Summit on Teaching and Learning.
- Trailblazing earth scientist Professor Dorothy Hill's legacy of mentoring female scientists will continue to be celebrated following a donation from UQ.
- A delegation of Queensland educators including UQ's Director of Domestic Student Recruitment Steve Forster <u>travelled</u> to New York in an effort to improve education prospects for students in Logan.
- **E10** Bhutan Government officials <u>plan</u> to counter gender stereotypes and break down barriers to women's participation as decision-makers in the workplace after completing a course at UQ.
- Twelve startup teams will be vying for victory during the 2018 Commonwealth Games after being selected for UQ's inaugural global HYPE UQ SPIN Lab sports innovation program.
- Fifteen eastern longneck turtle hatchings <u>have</u> a fighting chance at life after they were rescued and incubated by a veterinary technician at UQ.
- **E13** UQ welcomed 240 students in the Young Achievers <u>Program</u> to residential camps held at the St Lucia campus in January 2018.
- **E14** St Lucia parkrun, supported by UQ Sport, will <u>launch</u> on Saturday, 24 March.

- **E16** UQ researchers are combatting forecast <u>electricity price hikes</u> by developing a system to enable more households and businesses to produce renewable energy.
