LEARNING

- UQ has ranked number one in Australia and 110th globally in Nature Index's 2018 Top institutions table, and number one in Queensland and 48th globally in the 2019 QS World University Rankings.
- L2 Twenty-four members of the UQ community were <u>recognised</u> in the Queen's Birthday Honours.
- Professor Peter Visscher has <u>joined</u> the ranks of eminent scientists around the world with his election as a Fellow of the Royal Society of London.
- **L4** Professor Bostjan Kobe has been <u>named</u> a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science.
- L5 Professor Patrick Parkinson has been <u>appointed</u> the new Academic Dean and Head of School for the TC Beirne School of Law.
- **L6** Professor Mark Cooper will join UQ's Queensland Alliance for Agriculture and Innovation as the Chair in Prediction Based Crop Improvement.
- L7 Dr Nasim Amiralian and Dr Caitlin Curtis have been <u>named</u> winners of the ABC's 2018 Top 5 science program.
- **L8** UQ law graduate Rebecca Morrison was <u>awarded</u> the WLAQ Una Prentice Award for academic achievement.
- L9 UQ Pro Bono Centre is <u>partnering</u> with Civil Liberties Australia and Queensland Community Alliance to provide students with legal experience in human rights and civil liberties.
- L10 Industry partners have thrown their support behind UQ's Women in Engineering program, prompting a steady increase in women participating in undergraduate engineering studies.
- **L11** UQ law students were <u>recognised</u> for their academic excellence and community outreach at the annual UQ Law Awards.

- **D1** UQ research into antibiotic resistance links between nursing homes and hospitals has <u>received</u> a \$1.8 million government funding boost.
- **D2** An anonymous donation of \$500,000 will <u>fund</u> Australia's first dedicated aphasia rehabilitation and research centre.
- **D3** Genetic research aimed at improving healthcare will be the <u>focus</u> of UQ's new \$6.6 million Genome Innovation Hub.
- **D4** Healthy ageing and wellbeing is the focus of a new community-based clinic at UQ.

- **D5** A specialist rehabilitation and surgery centre has taken a major step <u>forward</u> with the formal signing of a 20-year partnership between Metro North Hospital and Health Service and UQ.
- **D6** A UQ research project to revolutionise the treatment of wastewater has <u>won</u> a national research innovation prize.
- **D7** An innovative bridge construction technique created by UQ engineers has <u>won</u> the inaugural World Innovation in Bridge Engineering award.
- **D8** A cheap and effective tool that could save lives by helping health authorities target mosquitos infected with Zika virus has been developed by UQ researchers.
- **D9** Evolution may be <u>responsible</u> for a range of complex traits, including height and weight-to-hip ratio, and diseases such as schizophrenia.
- **D10** A simple method to determine if fossil fuel producers are on track to meet global emission reduction targets has been <u>developed</u> by UQ researchers
- **D11** A tax on sweetened drinks would <u>save</u> \$666 million in oral health costs over a decade.

- **D18** A new technique that can generate quantum behaviour in a millimetre-sized drum has been developed by researchers from UQ and Imperial College London.

- **D20** Wage growth in Australia has <u>slowed</u> significantly over the past five years, with an ageing population a key contributing factor.

- **E1** UQ is set to become the first major university in the world to <u>offset</u> 100 per cent of its electricity usage through its own renewable energy asset.
- **E2** UQ will be <u>smoke-free</u> from 1 July 2018.
- **E3** UQ has <u>created</u> more than 100 spin-out companies based on UQ research since 1988, with most addressing unmet medical needs.
