LATEST NEWS FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND

LEARNING

- A \$500 million-plus software grant from Siemens will give UQ students and researchers access to advanced technology, building their skills in digital and data driven industries.
- UQ has <u>jumped</u> three places to 42nd in the world and third in Australia in the 2019 US News Best Global Universities assessment of the world's top universities.
- The School of Law has <u>jumped</u> 14 places in the 2019 Times Higher Education World University Subject Rankings, to be 40th in the world.
- Leading funds manager and UQ alumnus Matt McLennan has <u>donated</u> \$1 million to the School of Law to provide students with collaborative learning spaces.
- L5 Professor Daniel Zizzo has joined UQ's School of Economics as the Academic Dean.
- UQ has been <u>recognised</u> for its strong contribution to Queensland's export sector, winning the Education and Training category of Premier of Queensland's Export Awards 2018.
- UQ has <u>launched</u> its first 100 per cent online master's degree: the Master of Leadership in Service Innovation.
- **L8** Teachers from across UQ were <u>honoured</u> at the 2018 Teaching and Learning Awards.
- UQ alumnus Dr Vince Fitzgerald AO has <u>pledged</u> \$220,000 to establish a scholarship for Honours students looking to specialise in applied economics and econometrics.
- The UQ Pro Bono Centre has <u>joined</u> the Global Pro Bono Bar Association, providing students with a range of opportunities to apply their skills to international legal issues.

- A \$1.5 million gift from the Trevor and Judith St Baker Family Foundation will help <u>electrify</u> green technology research at UQ.
- **D2** UQ graduate Jordan English has been <u>named</u> the Queensland 2019 Rhodes Scholar.
- Associate Professor Jack Clegg who describes his research as a cross between cooking and playing with Lego has been <u>recognised</u> in the 2018 Prime Minister's Prizes for Science.
- **D4** Traditional Australian bush medicines have taken a <u>step closer</u> to market with \$1 million pledged to explore product commercialisation and sustainable agribusiness opportunities.
- UQ research projects into chronic pain and Alzheimer's disease have <u>received</u> \$125,000 each in funding under the Queensland-Chinese Academy of Science Collaborative Science Fund.
- Dr Kirsty Short has won a \$25,000 fellowship for her work on the long-term links between obesity, the immune system and influenza.

- **D7** Professor Anthony Cassimatis has <u>received</u> the Australian Red Cross's Distinguished Service Award for his work as the Chair of the International Humanitarian Law Advisory Committee.
- **D8** Professor Claudio Mezzetti has been appointed a fellow of The Econometric Society.
- **D9** Tracks made by dinosaurs the size of sparrows have been discovered in South Korea.
- **D10** Breast cancer patients will soon have a <u>better chance</u> of fighting the disease thanks to new pathology guidelines created by UQ researchers.
- **Plant** speed breeding could be part of the <u>solution</u> to minimise the devastating effects of drought and climate change on crops in the future.
- A model <u>developed</u> by researchers at UQ could address soil problems that cost Australia's wheat producers almost \$2 billion a year.
- **D13** UQ-led research recreating 450 million-year-old enzymes has <u>resulted</u> in a biochemical engineering 'hack' which could lead to new drugs, flavours, fragrances and biofuels.
