LEARNING

- L1 UQ moved to 66th in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings.

DISCOVERY

- **D1** UQ researchers have published the first ever <u>global dataset</u> of mining-induced displacement and resettlement, giving mining companies an evidence base to develop best practice.
- **D2** <u>Research</u> into the self-destruction of cells in humans and plants could lead to treatments for neurodegenerative brain diseases and the development of disease-resistant plants.
- **D3** An <u>international study</u> into avocadoes and the publication of its draft genome may be the key to improvements in future crops.
- **D4** Scientists have <u>identified</u> a way to help dermatologists determine a patient's risk of developing melanoma.
- **D5** Targeting psychological distress that results from loneliness and social isolation, a program has been <u>developed</u> to reduce loneliness, depression and anxiety caused by social disconnection.
- **D6** Researchers have found that one in nine Australian women are <u>diagnosed</u> with endometriosis by the time they reach the age of 44.
- **D7** UQ researchers have <u>found</u> that humans had caused significant land cover change on Earth up to 4000 years earlier than previously thought.
- **D8** An international study has <u>revealed</u> there is no single 'gay gene' and no way to predict sexuality.

- **D9** The number of children with lifelong <u>impacts</u> from Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) remains far too high.
- **D10** A UQ-led study has on threatened species habitat destruction <u>reveals</u> critical failures with Australia's federal environmental protection laws.
- **D11** A UQ study has <u>found</u> that distressed rape complainants are perceived to be more credible than those who control their emotions.
- **D12** UQ researchers have found that children with <u>access</u> to fixed play equipment and fewer electronic devices were more likely to meet national physical activity guidelines.
- **D13** A UQ and CSIRO study has <u>found</u> that wilderness areas where human impact is minimal or absent halves the global risk of species extinction.
- **D14** A UQ-led study has revealed that future demand for ethanol biofuel could potentially <u>expand</u> sugarcane farming land in Brazil by five million hectares by 2030.
- **D15** The ability to determine what's real and what's fake online could soon become a little easier thanks to artificial intelligence systems and research <u>developed</u> at UQ.
- **D16** Scientists reveal that acting to <u>reduce</u> climate change would cost much less than repairing the damage it would inflict in coming decades on people, infrastructure and ecosystems.
- **D17** UQ researchers have <u>discovered</u> a potential drug target for Alzheimer's disease an enzyme which has effects on both the immune and nervous systems.
- **D18** A study <u>has revealed</u> at the DNA level how coral interacts with partners like algae and bacteria to share resources and build healthy, resilient coral.
- **D19** Preoperative treatment for men with prostate cancer is being <u>researched</u> in a collaborative National Health and Medical Research Council funded study.
- **D20** Darker male giraffes have been <u>found</u> to be more solitary and less social than their lightercoloured counterparts, according to UQ research.
- **D21** In a collaborative study scientists have <u>challenged</u> one of the great mysteries of physics to bring quantum technologies closer to being part of everyday life.
- **D22** <u>Research</u> has found that women who experience early menopause have an increased risk of cardiovascular disease.
- **D23** An <u>international study</u> is testing Einstein's twin paradox using quantum particles in a 'superposition' state.
- **D24** A <u>study</u> in rats suggests even small amounts of alcohol consumed during pregnancy could cause harm.
- **D25** An online mapping and knowledge <u>platform</u> prototype could improve ocean migratory patterns of endangered species.
